is the first female Chief Jus-

tice of the Thirteenth Court of Appeals (Corpus Christi/Edinburg) after her election in 2018. She was first elected as a Justice of this appellate court in 2002.



Justice Gisela Triana
was elected in 2018 to serve on

the Third Court of Appeals (Austin). She also has over 23 years of experience on a trial bench, in both criminal and civil courts.



Judge Lesley Briones
was first appointed in 2019 to

serve as judge for County Civil Court at Law No. 4 in Harris County, Texas, and elected in 2020. She is also an adjunct law professor in Houston.
